Take these Items to be recycled

- * **Even unusable items WILL be recycled!**
- * **Books & magazines** — St Vincent de Paul, svdp.us.
- * **Clothing, shoes, leather & textiles** — St Vincent de Paul svdp.us.
- Packing peanuts & #6 block foam** — St. Vincent de Paul, svdp.us.
- Plastic bags** — Drop off for free at Safeway and other large retail stores, plasticfilmrecycling.org.
- * **Small appliances & electronics** — NextStep Recycling, nextsteprecycling.org.



Items that are illegal to put in the garbage

- * Appliances • Computers • Lead Acid Batteries • Monitors (over 4 inches) • Motor Oil • Sharps • Televisions • *Tires
- * Lane County transfer stations provides drop off collection of these materials (* fee item).

Items that require safe disposal

Chemicals — for cleaning, craft, garden & more. Free disposal by appointment only. Call (541) 682-4120.

Electronics — cell phones, computers, monitors, tv's & more. In Oregon, it's FREE to recycle electronics, visit www.oregonecycles.org.

Fluorescent bulbs — Glenwood transfer station & some lighting stores.

Paints and Stains — Glenwood transfer station & many paint stores, visit www.paintcare.org.

Prescription Medications — Free local disposal locations, visit lanecountyor.gov/hazardouswaste.

Rechargeable Batteries — Lane County transfer stations & some retail battery stores.

Sharps (Needles, lancets, syringes) — Lane County transfer stations (*only in approved medical sharps container*).

Dear Resident(s):

The community in which you live participates in the Multifamily Recycling with Lane County Public Works - Waste Reduction Services. As part of this program, facility management, in cooperation with our garbage hauler, provide mixed recycling containers on the property for use by our residents. To ensure that the recycled material remains a quality product, the property manager(s) has agreed to monitor and maintain the recycling and garbage areas and help educate residents about how to recycle. To be successful with this program, it is important that residents know how to recycle properly.

Your participation is voluntary, but necessary for the program to be successful. You can choose not to participate, and so do not have to use the recycling receptacle(s) on-site. However, if you choose to participate and use the recycling containers provided on-site, you must know the following:

- Garbage cannot be placed in any containers labeled for recycling.
- The materials recycled on-site may not include all materials considered to be recyclable in Marion County. These materials may be collected at a local neighborhood collection site. Ask the complex manager where the nearest off-site recycling depot is located.
- Materials must be cleaned, prepared, and separated as required by the local recycling hauler.
- Haulers accept the following items in the mixed recycling containers: newspaper, magazines, paper, cardboard, boxboard, tin cans, aluminum cans and foil, and only very specific plastic containers—Bottles and jugs for milk and beverages(transparent-can see level of liquid).
- The following items are not to be placed in the mixed recycling containers: garbage, hazardous material, glass, any other plastic, lids/caps, plastic bags (these can be recycled at local grocery stores), milk carton, shredded paper, cups, frozen food boxes, styrofoam, or packing peanuts.
- If glass is accepted at your community, please place only clean glass bottles and jars in the container marked for glass recycling. Glass does not belong in any mixed recycling container(s). Broken glass, light bulbs, flower vases, dishware, Pyrex, ceramics, ovenware, mirrors, windows, and any other non-container glass cannot be recycled.
- Haulers may refuse to accept all contents within the recycling containers if it is contaminated with non-recyclables or garbage.
- Residents are responsible for disposing of hazardous waste materials at the proper waste handling facility. This includes, but is not limited to: medical waste (sharps), motor oil, antifreeze, latex and oil based paint, pesticides, poisons, corrosive chemicals and cleaners, and fluorescent light bulbs.
- If children take out the trash and recycling, be sure they understand which containers to use.
- Know that it is now illegal to dispose of certain electronics in the garbage or in the mixed recycling (computers, televisions, laptops, and monitors) and these must be recycled at an appropriate facility. Fines could be up to \$500 per item.

A brochure from the local recycling hauler or Lane County Public Works explaining the materials recyclable at your community should be attached to this notice.
