IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING THE  
RECOMMENDED FIVE-YEAR PARKS AND  
OPEN SPACE SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT  
CHARGE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN  
(PARKS CIP) FOR FY 15/16 THROUGH FY  
19/20.

**WHEREAS**, the Lane County Parks Advisory Committee held a public hearing on January 15, 2015 to receive public input, and has recommended adoption of the five-year Park and Recreation SDC Capital Improvement Plan for FY 15/16 through FY 19/20; and


**WHEREAS**, Lane County Administrative Procedures Manual (APM) Chapter 1 Section 2b provides that Parks and Open Space SDC revenues are administered through annual development of a five-year Parks SDC Capital Improvement Plan priorities list; and


**WHEREAS**, Lane Code 4.670 requires the County to adopt, by order, a Parks and Open Space Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) that lists the projects to be funded with SDC revenues, their estimated cost and timing, and provides that the County may, by order, amend the list to add or remove projects.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Board of County Commissioners of Lane County **ORDERS** as follows:

That the five-year Parks and Open Space SDC Capital Improvement Plan for FY 15/16 through FY 19/20, attached as Exhibit A, be adopted, and the County Administrator is delegated authority as described in LM 21.145 to execute contracts and agreements for any projects identified in the Parks CIP.

EXHIBIT A

The FY 14/15 through FY 18/19 Lane County Parks SDC Capital Improvement Program is based on the assumption that projects will be completed as scheduled even if funding is uncertain. The program projects are scheduled based on relative priority derived from criteria such as secured grant funding, critical infrastructure need, Parks Advisory Committee and citizen input and, ultimately, Board of County Commissioners approval.

### NOTES

1. Three-mile Prairie Expansion - This land acquisition project is intended to gain direct access to this land-locked parcel.
2. Armitage Park Play Structure - This project is added as a result of frequent requests from park visitors for this amenity.
3. Heceta Beach - Restroom Replacement - This project replaces a vault system with a flush system and allows for reconfiguration of the existing parking lot to accommodate more parking spaces.
4. Perkins Peninsula Park - Picnic Shelter/Circle - This project establishes a picnic shelter or circle, similar to those we currently have at Orchard Point Park.
5. Perkins Peninsula Park - Play Structure - This project is added as a result of frequent requests from park visitors for this amenity.
6. Richardson Park - Replace Day Use Restroom #3 - This project replaces the existing structure that is experiencing structural cracking due to settling.
7. Park Play Structure Program - The intent of this line item is to prioritize the construction of play structures in Lane County Parks that do not have them.
9. Hendrick's Bridge Park - Boat Ramp and Parking Lot Improvements - - Identified as a "high" priority by the Oregon State Marine Board, this project will improve the boat ramp and expand the parking lot to better accommodate vehicles with a trailer. Preliminary plans have been drafted.
11. Schindler Landing - Restroom and Parking Lot Improvements - This project is partially funded by the Federal Highway Administration through the Forest Highways program (\$135,200) which means it is also listed in the Road Fund CIP. The remaining project funds are coming from the Road Fund (\$5,000) and Parks Operations (\$13,325). This project paves the existing parking lot and replaces the existing restroom structure.
12. Westlake Boat Ramp - This project improves this popular boat ramp to accommodate two streams of traffic in and out of the lake.
13. Perkins Peninsula Park Boat Ramp Expansion - This project improves this popular boat ramp to accommodate two streams of traffic in and out of the lake.
14. Triangle Lake Transient Dock Replacement - This project replaces an aging dock that was removed due to safety concerns. This project is fully funded by a grant from the Oregon State Marine Board.
15. Baker Bay Marina Expansion - This project will update and expand the current facility. No funding has been identified for this project. A possible funding source could be the sale of bonds similar to what was done for Richardson Park Marina, using slip rental fees to repay the bond over time. Currently, there are over 75 customers on the waiting list for moorage at Baker Bay. Some have been waiting for over 10 years.

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### NOTES

17. Hendrick's Bridge Park - Campground Development - This project establishes a campground facility on the east side of the park.
18. Richardson Park Campground - 6-site Development - This project develops 6 planned camp sites to include electrical, water, and sewer hookups.
19. Armitage Park Campground - Phase II - This project develops up to 40 planned camp sites to include electrical, water, and sewer hookups.
20. Fern Ridge Sewage Lagoon - This planning project is intended to provide the Division with a study and recommendations for the future operation, capacity, and configuration of the sewage facility that serves our Fern Ridge parks.
21. Mountain Biking Feasibility Study - This project evaluates the current park land inventory to determine if there are opportunities to provide accommodation for mountain biking activity.
22. This is the remaining amount needed to complete the Lane County Parks Master Plan. This will be entirely funded with SDC's.
