ORDER NO: 21-05-04-03

In the Matter of Approving Two Public Works Contracts and Amendments and Delegating Authority to the County Administrator to Execute the Approved Contracts and Amendments for BRING Recycling, Expense in the amount of \$76,000; Blackline, Inc., Expense in the amount of \$715,629.34.

**WHEREAS**, Lane Manual Chapter 20 sets forth the County's policies regarding award, acceptance, and amendment of grants and contracts; and

**WHEREAS**, all of the contracts or grants listed below have been accepted or award in accordance with the requirements of the Lane Manual, including the requirements for competitive selection; and

**WHEREAS**, all the projects and services covered by the contracts, amendments, and grants listed below are routine to the implementation of current County programs and services or have been previously discussed or approved by the Board; and

**WHEREAS**, these contracts, amendments, and grants exceed the County Administrator's authority to execute granted in Lane Manual sections 20.650 to 20.665,

Description	BRING will provide innovative waste prevention and reuse programs to school age children in Lane County. The goal of these programs is to educate students, staff, and their families about waste reduction, reuse, and recycling and to encourage these habits at school and at home. Programs include classroom presentations, tours to Short Mountain landfill, Glenwood Central Receiving Transfer Station and BRING's Planet Improvement Center, customized technical assistance, and collaborations with other community partners and non-profits in Lane County.

Description	Contractor will perform slurry seal application to Lane County roads including City of Eugene streets west of River Road and City of Springfield streets in accordance with project specifications and plans; construction is scheduled to begin after 7/1/2021 and completed by 10/31/2021; Cities of Eugene and Springfield will reimburse Lane County for their portion of actual expenses through intergovernmental agreements (IGAs) signed with Lane County.
